GRE Exam – A to Z Full Requirements

A. Age Requirement

- No official minimum or maximum age limit.
- Most test-takers are university graduates or final-year undergraduates.
- Some universities may informally expect applicants to be at least 18+.

B. Basic Eligibility

- Anyone can register regardless of nationality, age, gender, or background.
- No restrictions on undergraduate major.
- Primary requirement: a valid government-issued ID (passport for international test-takers).

C. Computer & Paper Formats

- **GRE General Test**: computer-delivered (most common).
- Paper-based GRE General Test: only where computers are unavailable.
- **GRE Subject Tests**: paper-delivered only (Math, Physics, Psychology).

D. Documents Required

- 1. Valid government-issued ID:
 - Passport (mandatory for most international candidates).
 - Name must exactly match registration.
- 2. University application requirements may include:
 - o GRE score report.
 - Undergraduate transcripts.
 - o Recommendation letters.
 - Statement of purpose (handled after the exam, not by ETS).

E. Eligibility Criteria

- No strict eligibility rules set by ETS.
- Designed mainly for graduate school applicants.
- Candidates should have completed or be near completing undergraduate education.

F. Fee Structure

- GRE General Test: **US\$220** (worldwide, standard).
- GRE Subject Test: US\$150 each.
- Special handling fees:
 - o Rescheduling: US\$50.
 - o Changing test center: US\$50.
 - o Additional score reports: US\$35 per recipient.
 - Score review (quant/verbal): US\$50.
 - Score review (analytical writing): US\$60.

G. GRE Types

- 1. GRE General Test
 - Verbal Reasoning.
 - Quantitative Reasoning.
 - Analytical Writing.
- 2. GRE Subject Tests
 - o Mathematics.
 - o Physics.
 - o Psychology.

H. How Many Times

- GRE can be taken once every 21 days, up to 5 times in a rolling 12-month period.
- Applies even if you cancel a score.

I. Identification Rules

- ID must:
 - Be original (no photocopies).
 - Be valid (not expired).
 - o Contain full name, photo, and signature.
- Most countries: passport required.

J. Jurisdictions (Availability)

- Offered in over 160 countries.
- More than 1,000 test centers worldwide.
- Subject Tests offered 3 times a year (Sept, Oct, Apr).

K. Knowledge Tested

- 1. **Verbal Reasoning** vocabulary, reading comprehension, text completion.
- 2. **Quantitative Reasoning** arithmetic, algebra, geometry, data analysis.
- 3. **Analytical Writing** critical thinking, logical argumentation.

L. Language

- GRE is conducted only in English.
- No translations provided.

M. Mode of Exam

- Computer-delivered (most locations).
- Paper-delivered only in regions lacking computers.

N. Nationality Restrictions

None. Open to all nationalities.

O. Official Scores

- Available 10–15 days after test (computer-based).
- Subject Test scores released in 5 weeks.
- Official reports sent directly to universities chosen.

P. Passport Requirement

- Mandatory for all international candidates.
- Must match registration details exactly.
- Name mismatches → disqualification.

Q. Qualification Requirement

- No strict educational requirement set by ETS.
- But:
 - Most candidates are undergraduate degree holders.
 - o Universities typically require GRE scores as part of graduate admissions.

R. Registration

- Online via ETS account.
- Phone registration available in some regions.
- Advance booking advised (slots fill fast).

S. Scoring System

- **Verbal Reasoning**: 130–170 (1-point increments).
- Quantitative Reasoning: 130–170 (1-point increments).
- **Analytical Writing**: 0–6 (0.5-point increments).
- Subject Tests: scaled 200-990.
- Score validity: 5 years.

T. Test Duration

- GRE General Test: about 1 hour 58 minutes (new shorter version since Sept 2023).
 - Verbal: 2 sections, ~41 min.
 - o Quant: 2 sections, ~47 min.
 - o Analytical Writing: 1 section, ~30 min.
- Subject Tests: ~2 hrs 50 min.

U. Universities Accepting GRE

- Accepted by thousands of universities worldwide, including:
 - US, Canada, Europe, Australia, Asia.
- Some business schools also accept GRE (instead of GMAT).

V. Validity

GRE scores are valid for 5 years from test date.

W. Waivers

- ETS sometimes offers Fee Reduction Program:
 - o 50% discount for eligible candidates (low-income or certain programs).
- Some universities waive GRE requirements (but ETS doesn't control this).

X. Exam Centers

- Located in all major cities across 160+ countries.
- Candidates must check ETS website for nearest center.

Y. Year-round Availability

- Computer-based GRE offered year-round.
- Appointments subject to local test center capacity.
- Subject Tests: fixed dates (3 times annually).

Z. Zero Tolerance Policy

- ETS strictly enforces rules against:
 - o Cheating, misconduct, using unauthorized aids.
 - Name/ID mismatches.
 - o Any violation may result in cancellation without refund.
